In addition to the money rec^d as stated, I have rec^d also a scrip dividend of 4 per cent on the Little Miami Railroad stock belonging to the Estate, amounting at par value to \$302.00

There is therefore a balance of \$1963.80 for distribution to the beneficiaries of my trust,

three quarters of which sum \$1472.43 is to go by the direction of the Will of E. Stone to Mrs. A. M. Stone. Three quarters, also, of the "scrip" dividend of the Little Miami R.R. Co, to wit, the certificate for \$200.50 is to go to the same person by direction of the same will. Her receipt, as my voucher for the payment is herewith submitted. The certificate of scrip rec^d from the Little Miami R.R. Co for \$785.00 I have sold for the sum of \$694.22 being the current rate. I have paid A. M. Stone also additional eight $\frac{43}{100}$ dollars on account of her collection of ground rent on the score of the quarter going to the Cincinnati College.

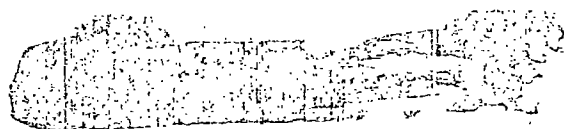
Statement as to the Principal

On filing last Report there was \$177.03 on hand for investment. On December 19, 1866 I paid Simmons & Co \$108. for a \$100 U. S. 10.40 year bond with its accrued interest, thus reducing the Principal on hand to \$74.03. Of the \$5. interest paid or due March 1, 1867 say \$3. with its premium, belongs to the principal & say \$2 and its premium belongs to the income and is accordingly so credited in his account, restated thus
